RESOLUTION 2021- -B: Acknowledgement of no-Cost Grant Application Submitted by Historian Wertis to 23 24 **Celebrate the Placing of Historic Markers** 25 WHEREAS, the Ulysses Town Historian was successful in securing grants from the Pomeroy Foundation for three historical markers and 26 27 WHEREAS, the placing of the markers should be cause for celebration of our rich history and 28 WHEREAS, the Historian has requested \$600 no-match required Celebrations grant from Tompkins County to promote 29 and host a special event to recognize the placement of each of the three new markers, now therefore be it 30 RESOLVED, that the Town Board extends its appreciation to the Historian for his efforts to educate the public about the 31 history of the Town of Ulysses and acknowledges submission of the grant application and further 32 RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor to accept the grants, if approved, to support celebrations to coincide with the placement of each of the three grant-funded markers. 33 RESOLUTION 2021-_____-C: Support for Tompkins County COVID testing for Municipal Employees 34 35 WHEREAS, Tompkins County has encouraged all of its employees to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and to provide a 36 self-attestation form to show their vaccination status and 37 WHEREAS, Tompkins County will require employees who are not vaccinated and those who do not return the Attestation 38 Form to comply with twice weekly COVID tests self-administered at their worksites and WHEREAS, the Tompkins County Legislature is considering extending this surveillance testing initiative to municipal 39 employees at no cost to the municipality, now therefore be it 40 41 RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Ulysses hereby urges the Tompkins County Legislature to approve 42 inclusion of the municipalities in their testing program and further

RESOLVED, that the Town extends its appreciation to the County for including municipal employees and acknowledges 43 44 that if the Town of Ulysses adopts a similar policy and wishes to participate, that the Town will comply with all of the 45 County's terms and conditions. 46 47 48 RESOLUTION # OF 2021: Approving Execution of Out-of- District Water User Agreement for Water District 3 49 WHEREAS, Daniel and Brooke Palmer are the owners of a parcel of real property located on 7048 Durling Road, in the 50 Town of Ulysses, County of Tompkins and State of New York, Town of Ulysses tax parcel number 12.-4-24 (the Property); 51 52 53 WHEREAS, the Owners requested permission to connect to the existing Water District No.3 in the Town of Ulysses (the 54 District), owned and operated by the Town, and to extend water service to the property to address serious water quality problems; and 55 WHEREAS, the Owners are willing to pay for and maintain the required extension of the water line from the water line 56 57 on Cold Springs Road and the associated appurtenances and fees related to the extension, 58 WHEREAS, on behalf of the District, the Town may benefit from the increased draw of water through the Water District system by the Owners which may improve water quality and from the offsetting revenue to the Water District, and 59 60 WHEREAS, both the Town of Ithaca from whom the Water District purchases its water and Bolton Point which provides the water for Water District No. 3 have agreed to the extension and 61 62 WHEREAS, the Town has verified the quality of water available from Water District No. 3 at this location and the Town 63 Engineer has approved the design for the connection, and 64 WHEREAS, the Town of Ulysses, on behalf of the Water District, is willing to consent to the connection of the Property to 65 the District on the terms set forth in the attached Agreement, now therefore be it RESOLVED, that the Town Board approves the terms of the Out-of-District Water User Agreement attached to this 66 67 resolution; and be it further 68 RESOLVED that the Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute the Agreement or any further revised version 69 70 of this Agreement provided that the final form of any further revisions is approved by the Attorney for the Town. 71 72 73 RESOLUTION #____ of 2021: SCHEDULING A PUBLIC HEARING ON LOCAL LAW #__ OF 2021 TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY 74 LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §3-C 75 RESOLVED, that the attached draft local law, the full text of which the Town Clerk is hereby directed to reproduce in the 76 minutes hereof, is adopted as the draft upon which a public hearing shall be held to consider whether or not to adopt the Local Law # __of 2021 to Override the Levy Limit, and be it further 77 78 RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby schedules a public hearing for ______ at 6:30 PM. 79 Access details for how to participate in the Public Hearing shall be posted on the Town of Ulysses website at 80 www.ulysses.ny.us at least 24 hours prior to the date of the hearing. 89	LOCAL LAW # OF 2021: TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §3-C
90	Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Ulysses as follows:
91 92 93 94 95 96	Section 1. Legislative Intent: It is the intent of this local law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Ulysses, County of Tompkins pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Ulysses, County of Tompkins to adopt a town budget for (a) town purposes, (b) fire protection districts, and (c) any other special or improvement district, and Town improvements provided pursuant to Town Law Article 12-C, governed by the Town Board for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.
97 98 99	Section 2. Authority: This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes the Town Board to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a local law approved by vote of at least sixty percent (60%) of the Town Board.
100 101 102	Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override: The Town Board of the Town of Ulysses, County of Tompkins is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2022 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the limit specified in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Severability: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.
109 110	Section 5. Effective date: This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
