13 RESOLUTION # \_\_\_\_\_ OF 2021 APPROVAL OF AGENDA 14 15 RESOLVED that the Ulysses Town Board agenda for October 26, 2021 is approved as presented/amended. 16 17 RESOLUTION #\_\_\_\_ of 2021: Adoption of 2022 Town Budget WHEREAS the Town Supervisor presented the 2021 Tentative Budget to the Town Clerk and the Town Board on 18 19 September 30, 2021, and WHEREAS the Town Board discussed and considered the 2022Tentative Budget at meetings on 10/6, 10/8, 10/14, 10/15, 20 10/18, and 10/19 and 21 WHEREAS the Town Board adopted the 2022 Preliminary Budget on October 19, 2021 and, in accordance with New York 22 23 State Town Law Section 108, set the Public Hearing date for October 26 2020 at 7:00 PM via Zoom, due to NYS Executive Orders related to COVID-19 safety; and 24 WHEREAS notice of the Public Hearing was in the newspaper on October 20, 2021 and also posted to the town's email 25 26 listserv, and website, and 27 WHEREAS, the 2022 Preliminary Budget was posted on the Town's website on October 20, 2021 and 28 WHEREAS a Public Hearing was held on October 26, 2021 where all members of the pubic were able to comment on the 29 Preliminary Budget via zoom, telephone, or in writing, and 30 WHEREAS the tax levy limit set by the New York State Office of the State Comptroller for the Town of Ulysses for the 31 year 2022 is 4.72%, 32 NOW THEREFORE BE IT 33 RESOLVED that the Town Board accepts the 2022 Preliminary Budget (as amended) to become the Final Budget for 2022 34 for the Town of Ulysses with a resulting 2.53% increase in the overall tax levy, which is within the tax cap, and with an 35 increase in the overall final tax rate to \$2.6201/\$1,000 taxable assessed value (TAV) for Ulysses residents living outside the Village of Trumansburg and with an increase in the tax rate to \$1.2666/\$1,000 TAV for residents of the Village of 36 37 Trumansburg and further RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall submit a certified copy of the adopted 2022 Town Budget to Tompkins County. 38 39 RESOLUTION # \_\_\_\_\_ OF 2021: Authorization to Include a Summary of the 2022 Budget in the 2022 Tax Bills 40

51 52	WHEREAS, a total of \$85,797 was budgeted into the appropriation line DA5130.2 Machinery EQ in the 2022 budget specifically for the 2022 Mack Granite, and
53 54 55	WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has received a quote, dated 8/23/2021 with quote number CONW2021000450A544, for the replacement vehicle for Truck 10, the 2007 International (VIN# 1HTWZAHR57J462683), which is a planned purchase per the Highway Capital Equipment Plan, and
56 57	WHEREAS, the 2022 Mack Granite will be financed at a flat 3-year payment plan of \$85,797 per year, which was included in the Capital plan presented to the Board during budgeting season, and
58	WHEREAS, no appropriation of equipment reserves in needed for this purchase, and
59 60 61	WHEREAS, the quote includes all required add-ons for the functionality required by the department (front plow, wing, salt spinner, etc.), purchase of this vehicle to ensure availability of a reliable and vital piece of equipment for snow plowing, hauling stone, and
62 63 64 65	WHEREAS, the source for these purchases and quotes is a vendor who has been awarded a Contract with Onondaga County (contract # 8996), the contract and quote listed is valid through June 23, 2023, per the Town's Procurement Policy and General Municipal Law §103(3), purchases made using County or State contracts are exceptions to competitive bidding requirements, and
66 67	WHEREAS, a significant lead time has been indicated by the vendor, and placing this order as soon as possible will help ensure a more timely delivery of the vehicle, and
68 69	WHEREAS, payment will not be required until the truck is delivered, which will occur in 2023 or 2024 due to the significant lead time, now therefore be it

And that suitable records shall be kept of each temporary advance, and
81 82	WHEREAS Resolutions 2019-160 and 2020-238 authorized an inter-fund loan for seed money for The Cemetery Road Bridge Replacement Project (PIN 375659 / BIN 3210360), totaling \$40,000, and

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84 85	WHEREAS reimbursement from NYSDOT is on a rolling basis and cash flow during the construction phase of the project increases the amount needed for cash on hand, and

87 88	WHEREAS the HB fund will pay back the A fund with money received by the grant from NYSDOT reimbursement and for the Tompkins County portion of the project cost, now therefore be it

WHEREAS, the Town of Ulysses is a Participant in the Greater Tompkins County Municipal Health Insurance Consortium (the "Consortium"), a municipal cooperative organized under Article 47 of the New York Insurance Law, and
WHEREAS, the municipal participants in the Consortium, including this body, have approved and executed a certain Municipal Cooperation Agreement (the "Agreement"; effective date of October 1, 2010),
WHEREAS, Article 47 of the New York Insurance Law (the "Insurance Law") and the rules and regulations of the New York State Department of Financial Services set forth certain requirements for governance of municipal cooperatives that offer self-insured municipal cooperative health insurance plans, and
WHEREAS, the Agreement sets forth in Section Q2 that continuation of the Consortium under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, or any amendments or restatements thereto, shall be subject to Board review and upon acceptance of any new Participant hereafter, and
WHEREAS, by motion 001-2021 the Consortium's Board of Directors recommends approval of the 2022 Amended Agreement, and
WHEREAS, the Municipal Cooperative Agreement requires that amendments to the agreement be presented to each participant for review and adopted by its municipal board,
WHEREAS, the Town of Ulysses is in receipt of the proposed amended Agreement and has determined that it is in the best interest of its constituents who are served by the Consortium to amend the Agreement as set forth in the attached 2022 Amended Municipal Cooperative Agreements, now therefore be it
RESOLVED, that the Town of Ulysses approves and authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to sign the 2022 Amendment to the Municipal Cooperative Agreement of the Greater Tompkins County Municipal Health Insurance Consortium, and
RESOLVED, further, that the Clerk of the Town of Ulysses is hereby authorized to execute this Resolution to indicate its approval, transmit a copy thereof to the Board of Directors of the Greater Tompkins County Municipal Health Insurance Consortium, and take any other such actions as may be required by law.

RESOLUTION #OF 2021: AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER AN INTERMUNICIPAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE VILLAGE OF TRUMANSBURG AND THE TOWN OF COVERT TO EXPLORE WAYS TO SUPPORT CAMP BARTON
WHEREAS, Camp Barton Boy Scout Camp, owned by the Baden-Powell Council, BSA, is at risk of being sold to pay our regional Council's share of a Survivors' Trust and to raise funds for an endowment trust to support scouting operations, and

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175 176 177	WHEREAS, Camp Barton, located in the Town of Covert, just north of Ulysses, is one of the few remaining lakeshore properties on Cayuga Lake that affords public access to the water, environmental protections so critical to the health of the watershed as well as a beautiful and versatile programming facility, and
178 179	WHEREAS, protection of the Camp and its undeveloped lakeshore is in the wider public interest beyond the scouts that use the camp, and
180 181 182	WHEREAS, the Town of Ulysses resolved on October 12, 2021 to allow Town Board Members Ms. Olson and Mr. Goldman to participate in discussions with the Baden-Powell Council and local advocates to explore the feasibility of saving Camp Barton, and
183 184 185	WHEREAS, discussions with representatives of the Village of Trumansburg and the Town of Covert resulted in a shared willingness to collaborate together to pursue exploring solutions that would benefit the public and save part or all of the Camp Barton property, therefore be it
186 187 188	RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor Zahler to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Town of Covert and the Village of Trumansburg to jointly explore the feasibility of saving part or all of Camp Barton for public use, and further
