- 16 RESOLVED that the Ulysses Town Board agenda for November 23, 2021 is approved as presented/amended.
- 18 RESOLUTION 2021-____: AUTHORIZING TOWN SUPERVISOR TO ENTER INTO FINANCE AGREEMENT TO PURCHASE
 19 2022 MACK GRANITE
- WHEREAS, a total of \$85,797 was budgeted into the appropriation line DA5130.2 Machinery EQ in the 2022 budget
 specifically for the 2022 Mack Granite, and
- 22 WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has received a quote, dated 8/23/2021 with quote number
- CONW2021000450A544, for the replacement vehicle for Truck 10, the 2007 International (VIN# 1HTWZAHR57J462683),
 which is a planned purchase per the Highway Capital Equipment Plan, and
- 25 WHEREAS, the 2022 Mack Granite will be financed at a flat 3-year payment plan of \$84,921.78 per year, which was
- 26 included in the Capital plan presented to the Board during budgeting season, and
- 27 WHEREAS, no appropriation of equipment reserves in needed for this purchase, and
- WHEREAS, the quote includes all required add-ons for the functionality required by the department (front plow, wing,
 salt spinner, etc.), purchase of this vehicle to ensure availability of a reliable and vital piece of equipment for snow
 plowing, hauling stone, and
- 31 WHEREAS, the source for these purchases and quotes is a vendor who has been awarded a Contract with Onondaga
- County (contract # 8996), the contract and quote listed is valid through June 23, 2023, per the Town's Procurement
- Policy and General Municipal Law §103(3), purchases made using County or State contracts are exceptions to
 competitive bidding requirements, and
- WHEREAS, a significant lead time has been indicated by the vendor, and placing this order as soon as possible will help
 ensure a timelier delivery of the vehicle, and
- 37 WHEREAS, the Ulysses Town Board has approved submission of a non-binding Letter of Intent on 11/9/2021, and
- 38 WHEREAS, the three-year financing details have been presented to the Board, and
- 39 WHEREAS, the first of 3 payments is due upon closing on the truck and the financing agreement, and
- WHEREAS, the Ulysses Town Board wishes to take advantage of the current interest rate as there have been indications
 that interest rates will rise in the near future, and
- 42 WHEREAS, the first payment of \$84,921.78 will be made from funds appropriated in the 2022 DA budget, and

- 43 WHEREAS, KS State Bank is not only the sole source of financing for the Mack Granite manufacturer, but routinely works
- 44 with New York State Towns and is familiar with the legal requirements of financing, and
- RESOLVED, that the Ulysses Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to sign the Formal Proposal for the three year
 Installment Purchasing Contract and further
- 47 RESOLVED, that the Ulysses Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to finalize and sign the financing agreement
 48 contingent upon Town Attorney approval of the final financing contract.

- 74 Resolution 2021-____: Re-Stating The Intent Of The "A236 / A915 Assigned Funds"
- 75 WHEREAS Resolution # 167 Of 2020: Re-Stating The Intent Of The "A236 / A915 Assigned Funds" established the intent
- 76 of the Assigned Funds at that time, and
- 77 WHEREAS, since that resolution there have been two additional assigned funds, and
- WHEREAS, the Town of Ulysses ("Town") has various Assigned Funds where sums of money have been set aside for
 specific use, and

- 80 WHEREAS, these Assigned Funds are allowed in the General Funds (the "A fund") and less formal than reserves allowed
- 81 by the New York State Office of the State Comptroller, and
- 82 WHEREAS, the appropriation of these assigned funds do not require a permissive referendum or public hearing, and
- 83 WHEREAS, the Town would like to re-state the intent for the assigned funds based the 2021 budgeting process and on 84 notes left in the previous budget years when funds were added to the Assigned Funds,
- RESOLVED, the following list of Assigned Fund titles are followed by the intended purpose of the fund when it was first
 earmarked:
- A915.1 Youth Recreation: the intent of this assigned fund is to use for Youth Recreation specifically per the 2019
 MOU with the Village of Trumansburg. The source of the funding comes from recreation program savings in
 jointly funded youth recreation programs. Future use to be decided jointly by Town and Village.
- 90 2. A915.2 Recreation: the intent to earmark funds for future expenses related to parks and other public spaces.
- 91 3. A915.3 Audit: the intent to earmark funds for future expenses related to the cost of auditing services.
- 4. A915.4 Legal: the intent to earmark funds for future expenses related to legal costs above and beyond the
 budgeted amount.
- 5. A915.5 Youth: the intent to earmark funds for future expenses related to youth commission. The source of these funds includes donations made to the Town for youth programs.
- A915.6 Environmental Protection: the intent to earmark funds for future expenses related to purchase or lease
 of land from farmers for environmental reasons e.g. buffer strips, stormwater retention ponds, or other ditch
 remediation best practices.
- 99 7. A915.7 TC Rec Community Rec Reserve: the intent to earmark funds for the Trumansburg Recreation Board for
 100 future plans to be distributed at the Ulysses Town Board discretion.
- 101 8. A915.8 Cemetery Repair: the intent to earmark funds for future repairs for Town-owned cemeteries.

Resolution 2021-____: Establishing The "DB231 / DB879 Repair Reserve Fund" Of The Town Of Ulysses Under Section 6-D Of The General Municipal Law

- 104 WHEREAS, the 2021 Town of Ulysses budget included the creation of a repair reserve in the DB fund, and
- WHEREAS, there is no referendum requirement for the establishment of a repair reserve fund, appropriations out of a
 repair reserve fund are subject to public hearing as prescribed by law, and
- WHEREAS, in an emergency, appropriations out of this repair reserve fund are allowable without a public hearing as long
 as a resolution for appropriation is approved by at least two-thirds vote of the full Town Board (not just members
 present at a meeting), as well as the requirement that at least one-half of the expenditure is repaid in the next fiscal
 year, and the balance repaid by the end of the fiscal year after that, and
- 111 RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Ulysses, duly convened in regular session as follows:
- 1. That pursuant to N.Y. GML 6-d there be and hereby is established a repair reserve fund in the DB fund.
- 113 2. Such repair reserve fund is to be known as the "DB231 / DB879 Repair Reserve Fund."
- 114 3. Such additional sums as may hereafter be appropriated shall become part of DB231 / DB879 Repair Reserve.
- 4. The Town Supervisor, in her/his discretion, may invest the moneys in the fund in the manner provided in section
 6-f of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York. Any interest earned or capital gains realized on the
 moneys so deposited or invested shall accrue to and become a part of the reserve fund.
- 1185. No expenditure shall be made from the reserve fund except by authorization of the Town Board of the Town of119Ulysses pursuant to the provisions of section 6-d of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York.
- 120 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

122 Resolution 2021-____: Establishing The "SW3-231 / SW3-883 Vehicle Reserve Fund" Of The Town Of Ulysses A

Specific Capital Reserve Fund For The SW3 Fund Vehicle Under Section 6-C Of The General Municipal Law, Subject To Permissive Referendum

- WHEREAS, there is a requirement to state the specific purpose and estimated maximum cost of the equipment in theresolution establishing a Specific Capital Reserve Fund, and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of this Reserve Fund is to accumulate moneys to finance the cost of a vehicle for the use of
 Water District 3 operations, with the estimated maximum cost of \$35,000, and
- WHEREAS, the 2021 Town of Ulysses Budget specified the creation and addition of this specific reserve, now thereforebe it
- 131 RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Ulysses, duly convened in regular session as follows:
- That pursuant to N.Y General Municipal Law (N.Y. GML) §6-c there be and hereby is established a specific capital
 reserve fund to cover the cost of the future purchase of SW3 fund vehicle.
- 134 2. Such specific capital reserve fund is to be known as the "SW3-231 / SW3-883 Vehicle Reserve Fund."
- Such additional sums as may hereafter be appropriated shall become part of the SW3-231 / SW3-883 Vehicle
 Reserve Fund.
- The Town Supervisor, in her/his discretion, may invest the moneys in the fund in the manner provided in section
 6-f of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York. Any interest earned or capital gains realized on the
 moneys so deposited or invested shall accrue to and become a part of the reserve fund.
- 1405. No expenditure shall be made from the reserve fund except by authorization of the Town Board of the Town of141Ulysses pursuant to the provisions of section 6-c of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York.
- 142 6. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town shall account for this fund in the manner outlined in N.Y. GML 6- c(10).
- 143
 7. 8. In accordance with N.Y. General Municipal Law Section 6-c(11) the members of the Town Board for the duration of their respective terms on the board are hereby declared trustees of this SW3-231 / SW3-883 Vehicle
 145 Reserve Fund and shall be subject to all the duties and responsibilities imposed by law on trustees.
- 8. This resolution shall take effect on the day following the thirtieth day after publication of notice by the Town
 Clerk regarding its adoption stating that it is subject to a permissive referendum unless a petition for referendum
 is received by the Town Clerk by the requisite number of voters in which case the resolution shall only become
 effective upon being certified by the Board of Elections as adopted following a duly held election.
- FURTHER RESOLVED that pursuant to General Municipal Law 6-c, this resolution is subject to permissive referendum
 conducted in accordance with Article 7 of the N.Y. Town Law; and be it
- FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk will post public notice of the permissive referendum in accordance with lawand provide a copy of such notice to the Town Supervisor.
